SW: Talik came home from school and he came up to me and said, "Mommy, you know this boy in my class said the n-word." He didn't say the whole word, he just said," the n-word", and I told him that it was a bad word and a lot of people fought hard not to be called that word and he shouldn't use it. It's not good. From the on, he never used it because we don't go around the house calling each other the n-word.

YC: We were all talking, and I don't remember how he said it, or what he said, I think it was something like, "What's Up Nigger or Nigger something," or something like that.
